Throughout our research projects and services, we became convinced of the necessity to raise the awareness of the interrelation between the regulatory framework and the e-government field: the regulation shapes organizational policies, business processes, as well as their supporting IS and services. This roundtable provides a timely opportunity to bring together and promote interaction between (i) policy-makers and regulators, and (ii) practitioners in the field of e-government. The main objective is to share the experiences, explore key issues and barriers, and highlight the opportunities that can be brought into light by better understanding between the stakeholders.

- Public Administrations (organizations and persons in charge of the e-government processes)
- Policy makers, regulators, legal practitioners
- IT solutions providers, from private and public sector
- Research community active in the domain

The roundtable is organised to give all participants an opportunity to discuss their projects, initiatives and opinions. Participants will be encouraged to engage with honest assessments of the intellectual problems and practical barriers in an open and constructive atmosphere.

#### ***Why is this round table of interest to the conference participants?***

Regulatory compliance is becoming an important research topic. The round table will investigate the opportunities that legal frameworks offer and the barriers they impose to e-government projects. Thus, it will contribute to the conference topic "Legal, agency, trust and governance issues in e-Government".
