The cherished ideal of implementation of e-government projects in developing countries essentially involves unnoticed dimensions not only of MORAL governance but also entails rigorous transformation of the personnel, power sector reforms, continuous monitoring, regular training, sufficient flow of resources, and above all a holistic approach to the need of administrative reforms. The developing nations are also faced with challenge of adaptability by the leadership. This requires changes in the legal frameworks and the increased accessibility and exposure to modern technological advances at different levels. In this backdrop there is a pertinent need for serious discourse on various aspects of roadblocks in the way of the implementation of e-government projects in developing nations.

This mini track is interested in articles that focus on but not limited to the following topics:

- Impediments in implementation of e-government
- Need for changes in legal frameworks for e-government
- Challenges of leadership attitude and adaptability
- Aspects of administrative reforms for e-government
- Monitoring, training and human dimensions of e-government
- Issues of technology exposure and accessibility of the masses

Submission details:

Product Demonstrations: Please submit an abstract of 200-300 words describing an e-Government product you wish to demonstrate and the audience it serves. Demonstrations themselves are expected to be approximately 15 minutes in length.

Paper Submissions

Abstract details: In the first instance, an abstract only is requested. This should be a minimum of 100 and no more than 300 words and must include up to five keywords and key phrases to be received by **26 March 2009**. Abstracts must include the proposed title for the paper, the full names (first name and surname, not initials), postal addresses and email addresses of all authors and a telephone number for at least one contact author. Please indicate clearly if the contact author is not the lead author.

Full paper: Only required once the abstract has been selected and not to be more than 5,000 words including abstract, keywords and references (the Harvard referencing rules need to be followed). Submission date will be no later than **14 May 2009**. Papers should be submitted as .doc or .rtf file attachments by email to the Conference Manager, [Elaine Hayne](mailto:Elaine@academic-conferences.org) at Elaine@academic-conferences.org.

Important information:

- The selection panel of the conference committee will consider all abstracts received by the submission deadline to ensure that the proposed paper is relevant to the Conference.
- The authors of abstracts that describe a relevant paper will receive a notification of abstract selection.
- All full papers received by the submission deadline will be double-blind reviewed by members of the conference committee to ensure an adequate standard, that the proposed subject of the originally submitted abstract has been followed, that the paper is of a suitable length, that the standard of English is adequate and that the paper is appropriately referenced using the Harvard referencing rules.
- For authors whose first language is not English we request that you have your work proof read prior to submission by a native English speaker (or at least a fluent English speaker). Papers can be rejected due to a poor standard of English.
- Papers that are accepted will be published in the conference proceedings providing at least one author registers and presents the work at the Conference (see the registration section of the conference website for more information about registration).
- Due to the large number of papers expected for this conference, the committee only allows an author to present one paper. Therefore, if multiple papers are accepted for presentation, different co-authors need to present each paper.
