Keynote Outline:

Experts say the average North American home has 25 electronic devices plugged into wall sockets every day. We SKYPE using full multimedia desktop computers and drive to the store using military grade GPS units. Children draw with computers powerful enough to run complex offices.

With the introduction of smaller tablet devices, might we pause and question if we might be able to do more with less? This presentation shares ICT experiences from East Africa and Central Asia, exploring ways in which simple technologies are changing teaching and learning in challenging contexts.
