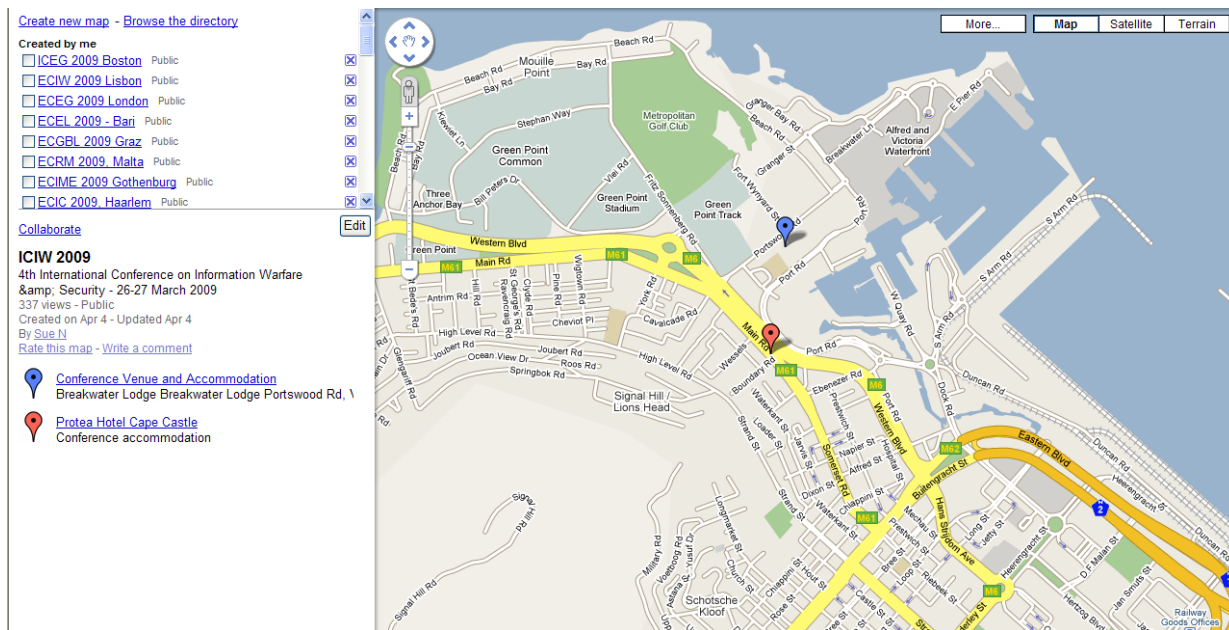
Joining Instructions Welcome to ICIW 2009

If you do not send in your presentation in advance you may lose some of your presentation time on the day. If you are not planning to attend the full conference it is essential that you tell us when you will be arriving in preparation for your presentation. If you are not present at the break before your session stream the Chair may assume you are not coming. Each session is allotted 30 minutes. This means a 20 minute presentation and 5 minutes for questions, leaving 5 minutes to change over from session to session.
