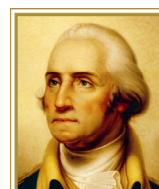

Information warfare, cyber-operations, and information security are areas of specialized research covering multiple areas of expertise. This conference is designed to bring together conceptualists, operators, and researchers to exchange and explore ideas covering these areas. Past conferences have attracted participants from all over the globe, providing for a rich environment of idea exchange.

Please consider submitting to this conference. We are interested in the entire range of concepts from theory to practice, including case studies, works-in-progress, and conceptual explorations.

Topics of particular interest include:

- Cyberwarfare practice and theory
- Information security practice
- Dual-use technologies
- Neural linguistic techniques in cyberwarfare
- The politics of cyberwarfare, including conceptual cyberarms agreements
- Information security management
- Cyber-exploitation execution and detection
- Other topics

All submissions associated with any element of information warfare and information security will be considered: imagination and thinking outside the box are encouraged!

As well as full academic papers, the following submissions are welcomed:

**Work in progress/Posters:** Researchers may submit current projects which are either at the proposals stage or are works in progress.

**PhD Research:** Doctoral candidates are invited to submit papers describing their research.

**Case Study Submissions:** Case study submissions should be written to publishable standards.

**Non-academic Contributions:** Contributions from individuals and organisations working in the field. These contributions can take the form of a presentation or a demonstration.

**Round Table Proposals:** Topical subjects to be proposed for discussion.

### Submission details

- Abstracts: All submission types require a 300-500 word abstract in the first instance, to be received by **26 August 2010**. Please read the guidelines at <http://academic-conferences.org/abstract-guidelines.htm>
- Submission: Only accepted by online form submission at <http://academic-conferences.org/iciw/iciw2011/iciw11-abstract-submission.htm>
- Full paper: Only required for academic submissions once the abstract has been selected, no more than 5,000 words to be received by **14 October 2010**. **Authors are advised that this is a final date. Earlier submission of the full paper helps us to manage the review process in a timely manner.** Papers should be submitted as .doc or .rtf file attachments by email to the Conference Manager, [Julia Hawkins](mailto:Julia@academic-conferences.org) ([Julia@academic-conferences.org](mailto:Julia@academic-conferences.org) )

All full papers will be double-blind reviewed by members of the conference committee to ensure an adequate standard, that the proposed subject of their abstract has been followed, that the paper is of a suitable length, the standard of English is adequate and the paper is appropriately referenced.
