### MINI TRACK CALL FOR PAPERS

**Mini-track on: 'Leadership for Sustainability'**  
**Track co-chairs:** Dr Paul Aitken and Dr Scott Lichtenstein

Society is beginning to ask pointed questions about the role of leaders in our increasingly interdependent and interconnected world and ecology. Despite best efforts, the leadership task continues to be driven by short-term financial returns and one-off sporting results. The leader role and profile in organisational and public life remains dominated by the Board Chair, CEO, and Coach.

Business educators and leadership development practitioners are waking up to a new dawn where the on-going viability of these leadership paradigms is being challenged. This track seeks contributions that mount a riposte to such age-old leadership certainties through four research windows:

- Leadership beyond the capabilities of a single leader
- Leadership resulting in sustained organisational/sporting performance
- Leadership delivering upon an environmental sustainability agenda
- Leadership through values promoting sustainability in business/sports/ environmental performance

The aim of the track is to develop the debate about forms of leadership and leadership culture that maintain capability and performance continuity over time.

#### **Submission details:**

**Abstract details:** The Abstract should be a minimum of 300 and no more than 500 words including up to five keywords and keyphrases to be received by **8 May 2008**. Please read the online guidelines at <http://academic-conferences.org/ecmlg/ecmlg2008/ecmlg08-author-guide.htm>

**Submission:** Via the online submission form at <http://academic-conferences.org/ecmlg/ecmlg2008/ecmlg08-abstract-submission.htm>. Please ensure that all required fields are completed. Abstracts must include the proposed title for the paper, the full names (first name and surname, not initials); postal addresses and email addresses of all authors and a telephone number for at least one contact author. Please indicate clearly if the contact author is not the lead author.

**Full paper:** Only required when the abstract has been selected and not to be more than 5,000 words including abstract, keywords and references (the Harvard referencing rules need to be followed). Submission date will be no later than **26 June 2008**. Papers should be submitted as .doc or .rtf file attachments by email to the conference manager, Elaine Hayne, at [elaine.hayne@academic-conferences.org](mailto:elaine.hayne@academic-conferences.org)

#### **Important information:**

- The selection panel of the conference committee will consider all abstracts received by the submission deadline to ensure that the proposed paper is relevant to the Conference.
- The authors of abstracts that describe a relevant paper will receive a notification of abstract acceptance.

- All full papers will be double-blind reviewed by members of the conference committee to ensure an adequate standard, that the proposed subject of their abstract has been followed, that the paper is of a suitable length, the standard of English is adequate and the paper is appropriately referenced.
- For authors whose first language is not English we request that you have your work proof read prior to submission by a native English speaker (or at least a fluent English speaker). Papers can be rejected due to a poor standard of English.
- Papers that are accepted will be published in the conference proceedings providing at least one author registers and presents the work at the Conference (see the registration section of the conference website for more information about registration).
- Due to the large number of papers expected for this conference, the committee only allows an author to present one paper. Therefore if multiple papers are accepted for presentation different co-authors need to present each paper.
