In 2017, she was recognized by the Temerty Faculty of Medicine for her multi-year contribution to undergraduate teaching with the Sustained Excellence and Innovation in Life Sciences Education Award. More

recently (2023), she was awarded the provincial Ontario Confederation of University Faculty Associations (OCUFA) Teaching Award of Distinction.
